



CAMBRIDGE ENGLISH COMPETITION 2010/11 TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. This competition is only open to individuals over 18 years of age who are English language teachers and who do not speak English as their first language.
2. Entrants must have at least an intermediate level of English (Common European Framework level B2) e.g. they can:
 - follow or give a talk on a familiar topic or keep up a conversation on a fairly wide range of topics;
 - scan texts for relevant information, and understand detailed instructions or advice; and
 - make notes while someone is talking or write a letter including non-standard requests.
3. This competition will begin on Tuesday 16 November 2010 and end at midnight GMT on Tuesday 1 March 2011. All entries must be received by midnight GMT on Tuesday 1 March 2011.
4. To make a valid entry, entrants must have completed all sections of this online entry form and completed Q13 in no more than 150 words. Incomplete entries and entries exceeding the 150 word limit for Q13 will not be accepted.
5. Only one entry will be accepted per person. The entry must be the original work of the entrant.
6. Winners and runners-up will be chosen within 14 days of the closing date.
7. If a winner cannot be contacted within 21 days of the closing date their prize shall be forfeit and we will choose a replacement winning entry.
8. Only winning entries will be contacted.
9. There are six first prize packages comprising a two-week residential course at Bell Teacher Campus in Cambridge, United Kingdom 14 August to 27 August 2011 including accommodation, daily breakfast and weekday evening meals (excluding lunch) and a core programme of social and cultural events. The first prize packages also include return economy class flights to and from the UK, airport transfers within the UK and £200 GBP spending money. There are 100 runner-up prizes of Cambridge ESOL teaching materials.

By submitting your entry you agree, if selected as the winner, to participate in all publicity reasonably requested by Cambridge ESOL and Bell, including without limitation press, print and online publicity including publication of both your name and photo. You also agree to participate in a filmed interview whilst in Cambridge, which may be used on public websites and other media. By submitting your entry you irrevocably and unconditionally waive all rights under Chapter IV of the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988.

12. Cambridge ESOL cannot and does not guarantee the winners will have or be able to obtain an entry permit to the United Kingdom for the purpose of attending the course.

13. Cambridge ESOL will not provide any insurance cover for the winners, including without limitation travel insurance. The winners will be solely responsible for obtaining any insurance cover they require at their own cost.

14. Once notified, the winners will be required to confirm within a then-specified time frame that they will attend the course and that they have a valid right to enter the United Kingdom for the purpose of attending the course.

15. If a winner is unable to attend the course, or is unable to obtain entry to the United Kingdom, or does not confirm his/her attendance and right of entry within the time frame provided, Cambridge ESOL reserves the right at its sole discretion to make alternative arrangements with the winner for a prize deemed by Cambridge ESOL to have an equivalent value to the prize described herein or alternatively to declare the prize forfeit and select a new winning entry.

16. Prizes are not transferrable and cannot be exchanged by the winner for cash or credit or any other product.

17. Cambridge ESOL reserves the right to cancel the competition at any time. No notification will be entered into.

18. Cambridge ESOL reserves the right to substitute the prizes at any time.

19. Cambridge ESOL reserves the right to disqualify any entry that Cambridge ESOL believes in its sole discretion to be in breach of these terms and conditions.

20. Cambridge ESOL decisions are final and no correspondence will be entered into. This competition is subject to English law and jurisdiction.

21. Cambridge ESOL accepts no responsibility for any costs incurred by any entrant participating in this competition or in claiming their prize.

Cambridge ESOL shall not be liable for any delay in, or for failure to perform, its obligations if that delay or failure is caused by circumstances beyond its control including, without limitation, weather, transport cancellations or delays, fires, strikes, insurrection, riots, embargoes, inability to obtain supplies including course cancellation by Bell Teacher Campus Cambridge, refusal or revocation of visa or regulations of any civil or military authority.
